

Stitching on Metal with Barbara Wright

Yes, you can stitch on metal. Use embossing metal, wool felt, cording and thread to create a 3" x 3" trinket box. The assemble technique can be used to make all styles and sizes of boxes. Choose a wool felt and thread color to highlight or match your metal. Use this technique to make jewelry, picture frames or add new dimensions to your art quilts.

Supply List

Basic Sewing Supplies (see website for list)

Sewing machine in good working condition

Rotary Cutter, small mat, ruler

Shears to cut embossing metal

1 sheet Stitch & Shape or similar product (or 6 pieces 3" x 3")

9" X 18" WOOL FELT

9" X 9" embossing metal any color

9" x 9" thin batting like Warm and Natural

Metallic thread to match embossing metal

Thread for bobbin to match metallic thread

Glue stick

Thread to stitch wool felt, matching or contrast

5 yards cording (like Rattail) or spool of thread like Razzle Dazzle to make cording.

1 package jeans needles

Button or bead for closure

Cording for closure
